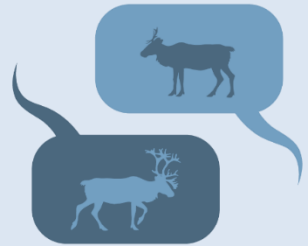


# SECTION 4.2.4: POPULATION NUMBERS AND TRENDS

	Critical Habitat is Identified As:
A	<u>the entire area</u> of the landscape category except permanent alterations, AND
B	areas that currently, or over time, would contribute to <u>at least 65% undisturbed habitat and maximize the amount of older forest</u> , AND
Mx	areas that currently, or over time, would contribute to <u>at least 65% mid-seral or older forest</u>

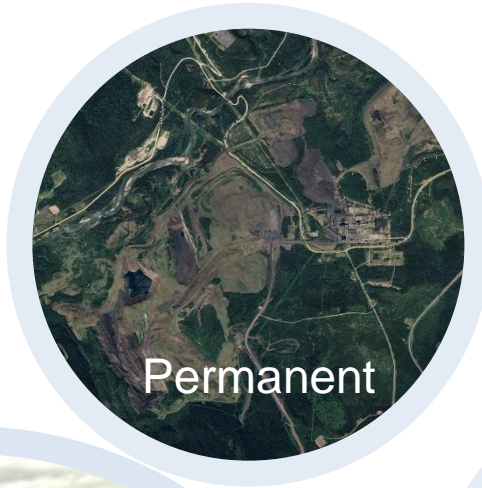
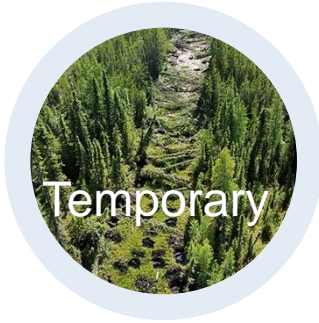
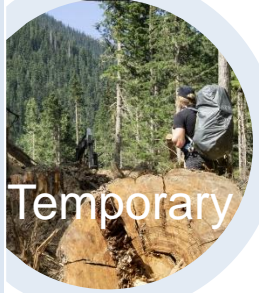
## INDIGENOUS LANGUAGE TABLES



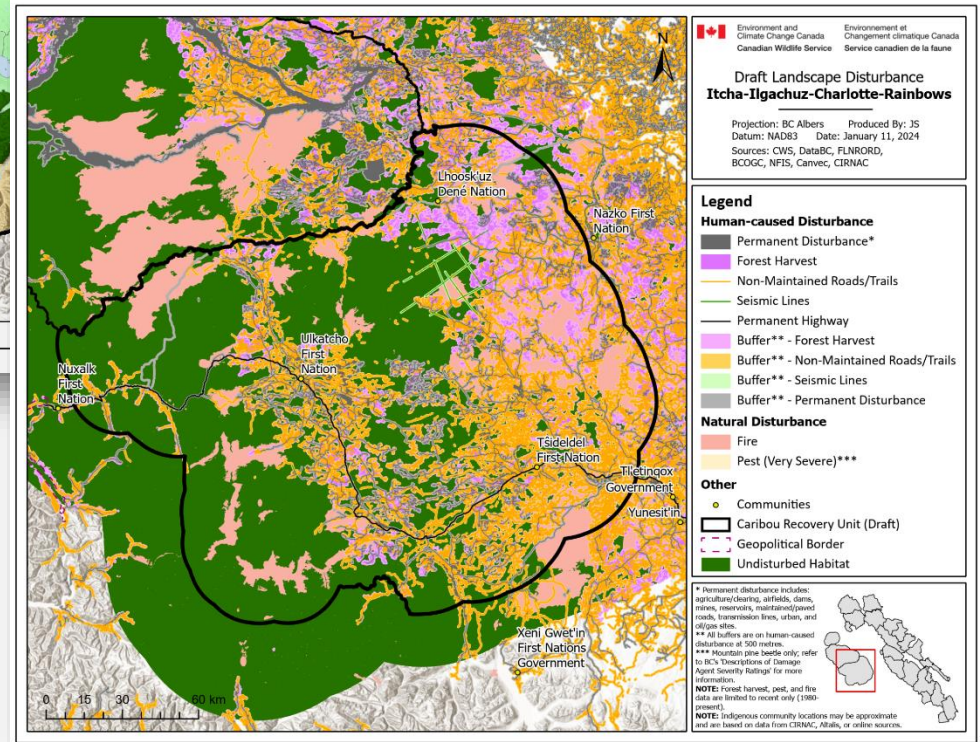
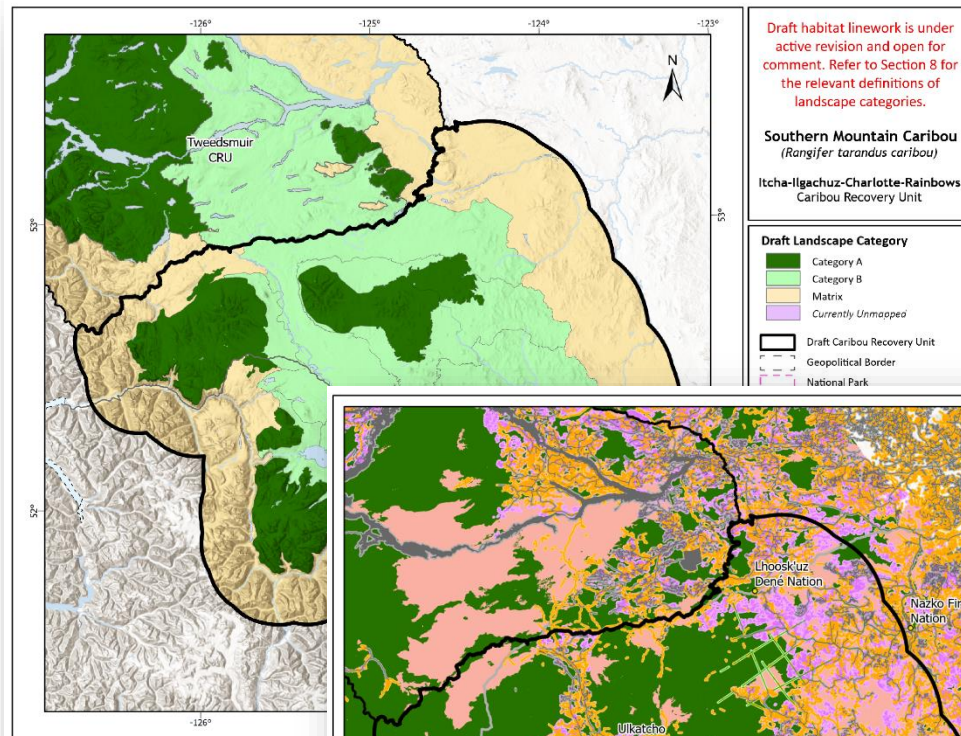
