










Critical Habitat is Identified As: the entire area of the landscape category except permanent A alterations, AND areas that currently, or over time, would contribute to at least 65% undisturbed habitat and maximize the amount of older forest, AND areas that currently, or over time, would contribute to at least 65% mid-seral or older forest


