



## Powering an Indigenous-led Clean Energy Future

Indigenous Clean Energy (ICE) is an independent non-profit organization that advances broad sustainable prosperity by amplifying First Nation, Inuit, and Métis leadership in clean energy projects.

Through capacity-building, career training, and mentorship with high quality and hands-on programming, ICE supports Indigenous Peoples in their clean energy journeys, while promoting meaningful collaboration with energy companies, utilities, governments, development firms, clean tech innovators, the academic sector, and capital markets.

### ICE PROGRAMS



#### 20/20 CATALYSTS PROGRAM

ICE's award-winning capacity building program has equipped over 125 participants with the tools and resources to become clean energy leaders.

This interactive six-month program connects First Nations, Inuit and Métis Catalysts to a network of clean energy project mentors and coaching specialists involved in project development both on and off-grid.



#### BIH PROJECT ACCELERATOR

The Bringing It Home Project Accelerator supports the development of Indigenous energy efficiency housing projects.

Over 18 months, participants benefit from a blend of virtual and in-person learning delivered by Indigenous and industry experts.

The curriculum is tailored to provide project development skills and in-depth knowledge of energy efficiency principles.



#### CHARGE UP

Charge Up is a third-party delivery program for NRCan's Zero Emissions Vehicle Infrastructure Program (ZEVIP). The program focuses on making electric vehicle charging infrastructure accessible and viable for Indigenous communities across the country.

Through the program, ICE covers 75% (up to set maximums) of electric vehicle charging station installation costs for Indigenous communities and businesses.



## ENERGY AND CLIMATE

The Energy and Climate team manages ICE's National and Global Hubs. Their collective aim is to ground policy and program work in the needs and interests of Indigenous communities and uphold Indigenous climate leadership. Their approach is based on an adaptive model of collective governance as informed by the Indigenous Nations we hold relations with.



## ICE MENTORSHIP

ICE Mentorship connects eligible ICE program participants with industry-leading experts from across the spectrum of the clean energy space.

Mentorships range from one-on-one engagements to cohort support from Indigenous and allied professionals, all working towards a just clean energy transition.



## GENERATION POWER

Generation Power is designed to engage both Indigenous youth and energy sector employers, positioning Indigenous leadership as an essential component of Canada's clean energy transition.

Taking a future-focused approach, the program introduces Indigenous youth to a broad range of clean energy careers.



## IMAGENATION

Facilitated in partnership between [SevenGen](#), [Student Energy](#) and ICE, ImaGENation is an intermediate project development program that supports Indigenous youth to launch clean energy projects.

The program is grounded in community, cultural identity, capacity building, network growth, and peer-to-peer support.
